This year we are partnering with an area non-profit for each concert in an effort to elevate their missions and to spotlight those in the community who are not sitting idly by. The non-profit partner for "A Light in the Darkness" is the San Diego Diplomacy Council, who are fostering convergence in a divergent world.

What Child Is This? is a traditional English Christmas Carol composed in the 1800s. This arrangement fuses the melody and lyrics of What Child Is This with the motives and harmonies found in Carol of the Bells, a Ukrainian carol. In light of the ongoing and heartbreaking conflicts in our world, we present this work as a call for peace on earth-a much needed refrain and reminder in this holiday season.

Arranger Abbie Betinis paints a cold landscape with her harmonic language throughout In the Bleak Midwinter until the warmth of light shining in the darkness enters the scene. In a time of year when it is easy to be caught up in consumerism and fancy decorations, this text highlights the wonderful power of simple, humble gifts such as hospitality and love.

Throughout Serenity (O Magnum Mysterium), you will hear a marvelous harmonic shimmer as the composer sets a traditional Latin text that illustrates a noteworthy tenet of the Christian faith: that God would enter into humanity in a lowly and vulnerable state, rather than that of a heavy-handed conqueror.

Enjoy listening to arranger Dan Forrest's boisterous soundscape featuring the musical embodiment of glory, angel choirs, and communal unity in this exciting setting of **O Come All Ye Faithful** that allows our singers' voices to resonate with freedom! -Aaron Burgett

Dona Nobis Pacem ('Grant Us Peace') by British composer Ralph Vaughan Williams makes up the second half of our program. This piece was composed in 1936 and is only rarely heard in the chamber orchestra version which we offer tonight. The piece is a stunningly powerful musical statement on the themes of earthly peace and conflict, incorporating texts by the prophets Isaiah, Jeremiah, and Haggai, alongside poems by Walt Whitman and excerpts from the Gospel of Luke. Vaughan Williams weaves these disparate texts together masterfully, forcing us to confront our shortcomings as a society, while still affirming our universal kinship, and humanity's promise and potential.

Ralph Vaughan Williams served as an ambulance driver during the First World War, volunteering for service at the relatively advanced age of 42. He witnessed firsthand the death of several comrades- an experience that would forever change his creative focus. The music that Vaughan Williams produced after the first world war is increasingly dark, even violent at times, which no doubt reflects the scars that the conflict left upon his psyche.

In the years between the two world wars, Vaughan Williams produced his anti-war cantata Dona Nobis Pacem. Throughout the piece, the soprano soloist sings only in Latin, like a minister continually pleading on behalf of all people, "dona nobis pacem". The baritone soloist, on the other hand, sings only in English. He is, perhaps, the voice of Vaughan Williams himself: first the soldier, and later the prophet, providing words of comfort and hope.

Vaughan Williams must have felt a special kinship with the poet Walt Whitman, who was also a veteran, caring for the wounded during the American Civil War. In Dona Nobis Pacem, the composer draws on Whitman's wartime poems, which capture so powerfully both the horrors of war, and the eternal flame of the human spirit.

As we ponder our own human frailties and the need for peace in our broken world, we turn once again to the words of the great American poet Henry Wadsworth Longfellow. An abolitionist during the Civil War, he wrote, "I have only one desire; and that is for harmony, and a frank and honest understanding between North and South." We sing his poem I Heard the Bells on Christmas Day in an arrangement by the songwriter Johnny Marks, made famous by Bing Crosby during the 1950s. As we sing these powerful lyrics of war and peace, may we always take solace in the promise they offer: "The wrong shall fail, the right prevail with peace on Earth, good will to all"!

KRISHAN OBEROI - FOUNDING DIRECTOR & PRINCIPAL GUEST CONDUCTOR

Krishan Oberoi, aka Renoir Kobashi, is a graduate of Yale University and a musical artist with numerous critical accolades. Ensembles under his direction have been praised for their "impressive warmth and verve" (Boston Globe) "startling depth" (Variety magazine) and "clear diction, perfect pitch, and clear purpose" (San Diego Union-Tribune). he is the Founder & Principal Guest Conductor of SACRA/PROFANA, a critically acclaimed San Diego-based chorus described as "a divine vocal canopy" by The Los Ángeles Times.

Hailed for his "visionary direction" (San Diego Story), Krishan has championed the music of living composers, conducting world premiere recordings of works by Shawn Kirchner, Sarah Kirkland Snider, and Pulitzer-Prize winner David Lang. SACRA/PROFANA's 2017 collaboration with composer Stephen Feigenbaum was described by Time magazine as "a sharply orchestrated piece of futuristic pop." Krishan has also prepared ensembles for Oscar-winning film composer Michael Giacchino, Tony award-winning composer Alan Menken, and producer Carlton Cuse (Lost, Locke & Key).

In 2022, Santa Barbara Music Publishing released Krishan's choral piece Telescope, with text by British poet Kate Wakeling. His music for the stage includes a 2015 collaboration with Emmy award-winning choreographer John Malashock. As Renoir Kobashi, he collaborated with Brooklyn-based playwright Rhiannon Ling in creating the original musical Best Time To Be Alive. Described by Lexi Lawson (Broadway cast of Hamilton) as "euphoric, magical... a musical masterpiece in the making", Best Time To Be Alive is currently in development with NYC-based BEDLAM Theatre.



AARON BURGETT - ASSISTANT CONDUCTOR

Aaron Burgett-an active director, composer, and performer-received his Bachelor's degree in Music Composition from PLNU, his Master's degree in Choral Conducting from SDSU, and now enjoys teaching and performing in a variety of styles. He has taught at schools and churches throughout San Diego County, working with students anywhere from the age of five to eighty-five. Currently, Aaron is the Director of Choral Worship at Solana Beach Presbyterian Church, as well as the Assistant Conductor of SACRA/PROFA-NA. When not making music, Aaron can be found filming weddings with his wife (Madeleine), playing fetch with their dog, or enjoying the Southern California sun on various outdoor adventures.

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JUAN CARLOS ACOSTA - Artistic Director

Juan Carlos Acosta is a critically acclaimed American conductor specializing in contemporary vocal music who has led world and regional premieres of choral works by Anthony Davis, Saunder Choi, Sarah Kirkland Snider, Kim André Arnesen, Brandon Waddles, and many others. He served as chorus master for the live world premiere of the film Star Trek: Beyond (Michael Giacchino)and the live premiere of music from the television series The Lord of the Rings: The Rings of Power (Bear McCreary). In addition to contemporary works, Juan Carlos has conducted nearly twenty different masterworks for choir and orchestra, and served as musical director and conductor for six productions of All Is Calm: the Christmas Truce of 1914, including San Diego Opera's award-winning production, which was hailed as "excellent" by Broadway World, "masterfully conducted" by the San Diego Union-Tribune, and "nothing short of amazing" by OperaWire. Juan Carlos has made conducting appearances with the New York City Opera, Vancouver Chamber Choir, San Diego Opera, Bodhi Tree Concerts, and the Los Angeles Choral lab. In addition to his role as Artistic Director, Juan Carlos serves as the Director of Worship at the Village Community Presbyterian Church, where he directs the Chancel Choir, Village Community Chorale, and Youth Choir.

SACRA/PROFANA is acclaimed for its musical diversity; merging pop, classical, and contemporary music with its commitment to amplifying the artistic voices of women, and individuals from diverse cultural backgrounds, alongside traditional works. Season 15 promises continued innovative choral programming, renewed collaborations with local and regional artists/groups, and service to the surrounding community through unforgettable performances and education programs that change choral students' lives. SACRA/PROFANA has accomplished remarkable things in 14 previous seasons, including numerous world and U.S. premieres and collaborations with leading regional arts organizations: San Diego Symphony, Art of Elan, San Diego Opera, California Ballet, and many more.

SACRA/PROFANA has also performed with many artists of worldwide renown, including the legendary Irish band the Chieftains, Producer Carlton Cuse (of ABC's hit show Lost), composer Michael Giacchino (Star Trek), and composer Alan Menken and Lyricist Stephen Schwartz in the development of Disney Theatrical's "The Hunchback of Notre Dame" at La Jolla Playhouse.

Some recent highlights include performing the trailer for Amazon Pictures' "Lord of the Rings: Rings of Power" at Comic-Con 2022, and presenting the world premiere performance of the complete song cycle of Amy Gordon's "Songs of Hope in Strange Times." SACRA/PROFANA was also honored to receive the 2023 Chorus America Education and Community Engagement Award.

A debut album, "Elegies & Ecstasies," was released in 2012, and in 2014 SACRA/PROFANA produced the world premiere recording of "when we were children" by Pulitzer Prize-winning composer David Lang, available on the Cantaloupe Music record label. Their second album, "A Longing for Christmas" was released in 2021.
